The Tenth Commandment forbids craving things that belong to others.

Coveting is looking with desire at a person who belongs to someone else, as by marriage, or at another's possessions, or even craving someone else's circumstances; desiring for myself that which clearly belongs to someone else.

To covet is to sin against God by lodging a complaint against Him: "God, why haven't you given me what you gave to that other person?"

James 1:12-17 speaks to the temptation to covet, while reminding us that God is in control and is to be trusted by His people.

6. Read Luke 12:13-21. What warning did Jesus give? How can you apply His warning?
