5. James speaks of self-deception in 1:16, 22, and 26. What danger is he highlighting and why does it matter?
6. In 1:27, James calls us to go and love those the world doesn't often serve and love. How are you being intentional about serving those in distress?
7. What are some steps you've taken recently to keep yourself "unstained from the world"?
