

Questions

1. What are some of the names/titles given for Jesus in John 1 and what do they mean for your life today and the circumstances you are facing?
2. What does the name Jesus mean? Why is that name important?
3. Read John 1:10; 1:29; 1:17; 6:33; 8:12; 12:47; 14:17; 17:25. John uses the word *world* about 80 times. There are times he uses it to contrast that which is of God against the world that is of man. There are other times he uses it like in these passages. Are these verses referring to all people everywhere or are they being used to speak of humanity without distinction? Why?
4. Reflect on Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away sin. If you are trusting in Him, pause and give Him praise for how His blood covers your sin and frees you from eternal death.
5. Read Ephesians 1:7-12. How does this passage echo and elaborate on the truth that Jesus is the "chosen one of God"? Chosen when and for what? What does v. 12 say should be the result of that?
6. Why were the truths about Jesus and His relationship to the Spirit of God so astounding to John the Baptist? Think about the act of water baptism. It is an immersion that publically identifies us. How is the baptism of the Spirit an immersion that identifies? Into what is the believer placed and how does it change your life?
