Questions to Consider

1. How do Jesus' miraculous works/signs that John mentions in his gospel strengthen your faith in Jesus?
2. Verse 26 says, "you do not believe because you are not among my sheep." That means something theologically *very* different than if the statement was flipped ("You are not among my sheep because you do not believe."). Most of us might intuitively think that Jesus' statement should be flipped, but it's not. What's the theological implication? How do John 3:5-8; 6:44, 65 help to explain the truth contained in verse 25?
3. Do you ever think your faith will fail? Or that Satan may prevail?
4. Why are verses 28/29 such a sweet and precious promise?
5. Where else in Scripture would you go to support the claim that "I and the Father are one"?
6. What's the significance of "Scripture cannot be broken"? (v.25)
7. Where does Jesus find his sheep (vv.40-42)? What's the significance of this?
