In verses 2-12, James reminds us of 4 truths that we must remember to live wisely in trials.

1.	In trials we must remember that God providentially uses trials to strengthen our faith
	(v2-4).

2. In trials we must remember that God has the wisdom we're lacking (v5-8).

3.	In trials we must remember to celebrate our eternal position in Christ (vg-11).
4.	In trials we must remember that God's future reward to those who endure trials is a
