The Sermon on the Mount as a manifesto of King Jesus

The book of Matthew alternates between narration of what Jesus did and transcripts of five major discourses that He spoke. The Sermon on the Mount is the first discourse.

The centrality of the kingdom of God to Jesus' public ministry

Embrace the Sermon on the Mount, don't evade it.

Obey the Sermon on the Mount, but don't be overwhelmed by it.
