When we are afraid, this is because everything feels out of control-we have a problem or a tough situation, and there is nothing that we can do about it.  This Psalm tells us what we should do when we feel afraid, and it makes perfect sense!  When we are afraid, we must turn to the one who does have control-God! Even when we cannot understand our situation or do not like our circumstances, God is still in control, and He is still good!  We can believe that His plans are bigger and better than ours, and put our trust in Him. | PONDER THE TRUTH | This verse is very encouraging and comforting. Here we are reminded that the LORD is God! What does this really mean? If we read a little bit further, we can begin to see what the Psalmist was saying. Later on we are reminded that God is our maker, and we are like sheep, while God is like a shepherd to us. These are to show that God is bigger than we are, He is more powerful than we are, and He knows exactly what we need. When the Psalmist says that the LORD is God, this means the same thing! God knows exactly what we need because He made us, He loves us, protects us, and cares for us like a shepherd cares for sheep, and He is GOD-He is more than able to do it! | not a verse of thanksgiving,<br>either. However, there is<br>something wonderful about this<br>verse! This verse is a<br>statement of fact. In this verse<br>the author is staing a very true | delight!  Have you ever been so excited about God that you made a joyful noise? Psalm 95 starts off with instructions for us. We are supposed to make joyful noises to the Lord! Read the verse again to see if you can tell why we are making joyful noises. Did you find it? We make joyful noises to thank God and to praise him!  After you add this verse to journal, maybe you can try making joyful noises to the Lord. Sing a worship song, play an instrument, or just hum a tune to thank God for what a great God he is! | This Psalm is a very special promise for God's people. Let's look at it closely today! What does it mean when it says, the "valley of the shadow of death"? Well, a valley is a very low place and it is often dry like a desert, and the shadow of death doesn't sound like a very nice place either. This is a description of what it feels like to be in a difficult place or situation, where we are struggling or are tempted to sin. Sadly, because we live in a world with sin and we sin ourselves, we end up in this kind of place quite often! But this verse also brings good news!!! Even when everything seems to be falling apart all around us, we do not need to fear because our Lord is our shepherd. He will care for us, protect us, and make sure that we do not run away from what is good and right. We do not need to fear. Let's read slowly through Psalm 23, and think about this promise. | This Psalm teaches us how God views us. We were each "fearfully and wonderfully made." This truth is a big idea to ponder. Wonderful is a pretty easy word for us to understand, but what does it mean to be fearfully made? Sometimes when we come across confusing ideas in the Bible it helps us to understand the word more. When the Bible was originally written it was not written in English, it was written in Greek and Hebrew. The word "fearfully" here is a word that means awe or reverence or respect. Basically, we are made so wonderfully and amazingly well that we should be in awe of the one who made us. In your journal today, write out this verse and above the word fearfully, write "yare" which is the Hebrew word for fearfully. Then take a minute to think about what this verse is saying. YOU are unique and wonderful-praise God for making you! |   |   |

At church we use the ESV translation of the Bible, and that is the translation used in the box above. Sometimes, when we study the Bible, it can be helpful to use another version to see what a verse is saying. For students, the NIrV is a great translation to look for when studying because the verses are often written in a version of English that makes sense for students. Here is the translation of this verse in the NIrV: "The earth belongs to the Lord. And so does everything in it. The world belongs to him. And so do all those who live in it." Ponder this verse and write your version of it in your notebook. Also think about why this is an important verse to know and learn. What are we reminded of with this scripture? | The writer of this verse is giving us a great suggestion! Let's praise the Lord. Ponder some ways that you can praise the Lord. Draw or write a list of these Ways to Praise in your notebook today. For some of us this is hard to do, but we can pray and ask God to help us worship him and praise him well. Maybe we should start by praying and telling God how great he is today! | Today we need a Bible study tool: context clues! There are times when we read a verse and it does not really make sense so we need to look it up in the Bible and read what comes before and after the verse to better understand the verse. Read Psalm 46 and think about what is happening in the first 9 verses. The author is talking about troubles and the nations raging. He is describing difficult times. The kind of times that might cause us to be fearful or nervous. Then, in verse 10 he quotes God. What does God say? Next time things are difficult, remember that God tells us to "Be still and know" that he is God and he is in charge! Good job using context clues today! | think it means to have your way be pure? Verse five is the reason why we should do all of these things: the LORD is good! His | This verse is a fun verse to read because it asks a question and then it ansers that very same question! See if you can find the question and then find the answer.  Why might the author have done that? It is probably because he knew that it is a question we often ask ourselves, and he wanted to provide the answer that God promises His people. (See, I just did it with you. I asked a question that I knew you were probably asking in your head, and then I answered it!) Try and think of a time when you made a big mistake, or were so confused, scared, sad, that you could not get yourself out of the great big mess you were in! We all end up in these situations, where whether we want to admit it or not, we simply need help from someone else. And we know that God will be with His people, and He will protect them, so when we are in one of these messy or hard situations, we must turn to God for help! | context might help. Let's read Psalm 3:1-2 to understand what comes before our verse. What is the author saying in the first 2 verses? Right! His enemies (foes) are rising up against him. He is probably feeling discouraged right now. But then he remembers something very important: God is his shield! What does the next part mean? Why would we need God to lift our heads? This is an example of figurative speech. The author does not mean that God will actually life up David's head! What he is saying here is that God will change him from being sad and defeated (probably hanging his head) to a place where he will be honored and celebrated. God will bring David back to a place of joy (where he will look up joyfully | There are two words used here to describe God: gracious and merciful. These words are often confused, but they actually mean two different things. Grace is when a preson recieves something that they do not deserve, and God's mercy is when a person does not recieve what they do deserve. God is merciful to not punish His people and He is gracious to save them and bless them. This does not mean that every person who has ever lived is saved. But God still gives mercy and grace to eveyone. Can you think of any ways that this is true? (Giving people life, providing them with the things they need to live, having the sun shine and bringing rain to grow plants, etc;) But ultimately, God's mercy is seen through Jesus, and what He did to save His people. Let us praise Him for all of these things!!! | praised by the angels, and the sun and the moon and the stars and all His creation.
